**The Committee bill is a \$2.18 billion or 5.5% decrease in current year funding as compared to last year.** It is critical to note that last year, Congress included \$4.759 billion for Census 2000 (\$4.476 of which was declared an emergency). This year the Committee provides \$671 million for the Census, a reduction of \$4.088 billion. **When this one-time spending for the Census is removed from the baseline, the bill actually contains a \$1.9 billion or 5.4% increase for other programs.**

**GENERAL PROVISIONS OF NOTE:**

New Fees: The bill establishes a Genealogy Fee for research performed by the INS. The amount of the fee will be set administratively at a level to ensure full recovery of costs.

New Fees: The bill establishes a Premium Fee for Employment Based Petition and Applications to the INS. The fee is set at \$1,000, may be adjusted for inflation and is in addition to any other applicable fees.

DOJ Litigation Reimbursement: The bill modifies current law to provide that the Dept of Justice may only receive reimbursement from other federal agencies for litigation costs for cases in which the United States, an agency, or officer is a defendant

Instant Check System: The bill continues prior year language prohibiting fees for the Brady Instant Check Background System as well as prohibiting the retention of any list of individuals approved under the system.

Religious and Moral Protection: The bill continues prior year language prohibiting any DOJ funds from being used to discriminate or denigrate moral or religious beliefs.

Kyoto Protocol: The bill prohibits the use of funds to implement the Kyoto Global Warming Treaty
