

## C-130J/C-130J-30 ACQUISITION

**Background:** The C-130J is the latest generation C-130 that incorporates a redesigned, two-crew member flight station, a modern technology propulsion system, and an integrated digital avionics subsystem. The program continues a modernization effort focused on eventually replacing aging C-130E aircraft. This is a Commercial Acquisition and SAF/AQ has directed the program to use commercial practices and to streamline all contract provisions. Congress appropriated \$209M in FY 97 NGREA for the acquisition of 4 C-130J's for the Air National Guard and \$226M in FY 98 NGREA for 4 additional J's. These 8 aircraft are currently being delivered to the 135<sup>th</sup> AW, Baltimore, MD. For FY 99 the ANG began an initiative to procure the C-130J-30, which is a stretched version of the basic J. Congress added \$192 million to the FY99 budget for three C-130J-30 aircraft for the Air National Guard. These first three aircraft are destined for the 143<sup>rd</sup> AW, Quonset Point, Rhode Island. FY 2001 appropriations provided funding for two aircraft for the 146<sup>th</sup> AW, Channel Islands, California. Five aircraft are required to complete the buy for Rhode Island and four to continue the conversion for California.

**Documentation:** Operational Requirements Document (ORD) #CAF (AMC) 005-91-IV/IIIA was approved 1 Aug. 95 by AF/CV. A Single Acquisition and Management Plan was approved by SAF/AQ on 13 May 1996.

**Impacts If Not Funded:** If future C-130J's and the associated spares and support equipment are not funded, the Air National Guard would have a mixed unit of J's and E's. The 143<sup>rd</sup> AW at Rhode Island would have 3 C-130J-30s and 5 C-130E's. The 146<sup>th</sup> AW at Channel Islands would have 2 C-130J-30s and 10 C-130Es This would have a severe impact on aircrew and maintenance training, logistics, and manpower. In addition, no funding future J model acquisitions would prevent modernization of the C-130E fleet.

**Recommendation:** The National Guard Association of the United States urges the Congress of the United States to authorize and appropriate \$290M in FY 2003 to procure four C-130J-30 aircraft, plus spares and support equipment for the Air National Guard.
