On December 13, 2001, Senator Christopher Bond (R-MO) offered an amendment to the Farm Bill (S. 1731). It would have allowed the President to override laws, such as the Clean Water Act, Safe Drinking Water Act and Clean Air Act, that "would be likely to have a significant adverse economic impact on or jeopardize the safety of agricultural producers". Senator Allard voted against tabling this anti-environmental amendment. The Sierra Club believes that Americans should hold their elected representatives accountable by voicing their concerns about important issues such as clean air and clean water.
