Con. Res. 83). The Senate's budget for Fiscal Year 2002 reduced funding for natural resources and environmental programs by \$2.1 billion from the previous year. This funding level would fail to provide adequate funding for protection of our natural resources, air, water, oceans, coasts, parks, open spaces, wild places and our endangered and threatened species. Senator Allard voted against the Corzine amendment, which would have restored these cuts and increased overall funding by 4%.</p>

<p>and against holding industries responsible for the pollution they create.</p>	<p>On December 13, 2001, Senator Christopher Bond (R-MO) offered an amendment to the Farm Bill (S. 1731). It would have allowed the President to override laws, such as the Clean Water Act, Safe Drinking Water Act and Clean Air Act, that "...would be likely to have a significant adverse economic impact on or jeopardize the safety of agricultural producers....". Senator Allard voted against tabling this anti-environmental amendment.</p>

Ask him to help clean up Colorado's air and protect our children's health.</p> <p>Tell him to vote in upcoming budget bills to enforce clean air laws -- for our families, for our future.</p>	<p>The Sierra Club believes that Americans should hold their elected representatives accountable by voicing their concerns about important issues such as clean air and clean water.</p> <p>In September, the Senate is expected to consider budget bills that will affect enforcement of clean air laws.</p>
