

# Obligation of Federal Highway Funds, FY 2001

Washington, D.C. – In March 2001, \$2.64 billion of federal highway funds were obligated by state and local departments of transportation (DOT) for highway and bridge projects, a 13.2% increase over the amount obligated in March 2000, according to an analysis of Federal Highway Administration data by the American Road and Transportation Builders Association. Obligation of federal funds is the first step in bringing federal-aid highway and bridge projects to construction.

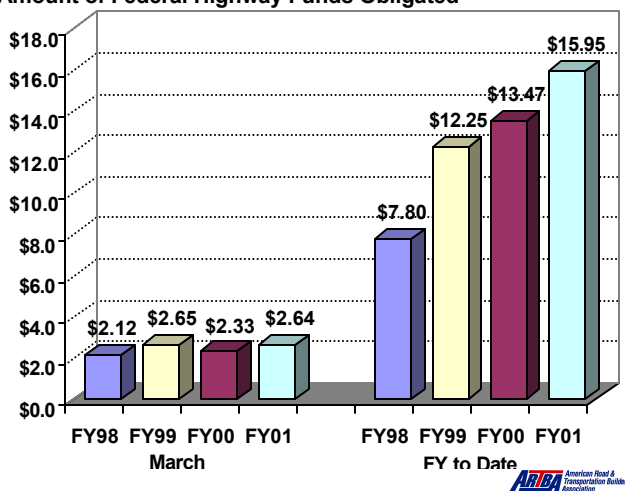
During the first six months of federal fiscal year 2001, a total of \$15.95 billion of federal highway funds was obligated for highway, bridge and related projects eligible for federal aid, 18.4% more than during the first six months of FY 2000. To date, states have obligated 56.5 percent of their formula funds, which must be used during the year or lost, and 24.7 percent of their Minimum Guarantee, High Priority Project and Appalachian highway funds, which are available until used.

When a state or local DOT has an eligible project ready to go under the federal-aid highway program, it enters into a project agreement with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) which obligates the federal government to pay its share of the project cost. The project can then proceed to bidding and construction. Under the Transportation Equity Act for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (TEA-21), federal aid to the states for highway and bridge projects will increase about 50 percent. As states obligate these funds for projects, lettings and construction work should also rise significantly.

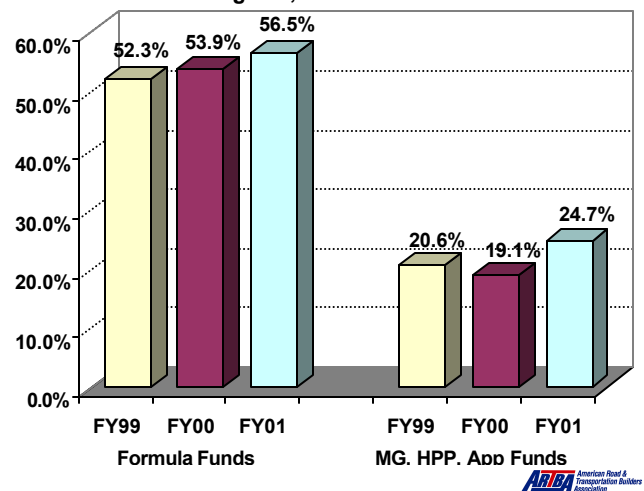
## Federal Highway Funds Obligated by the States

Percent of Funds Obligated, Year to Date



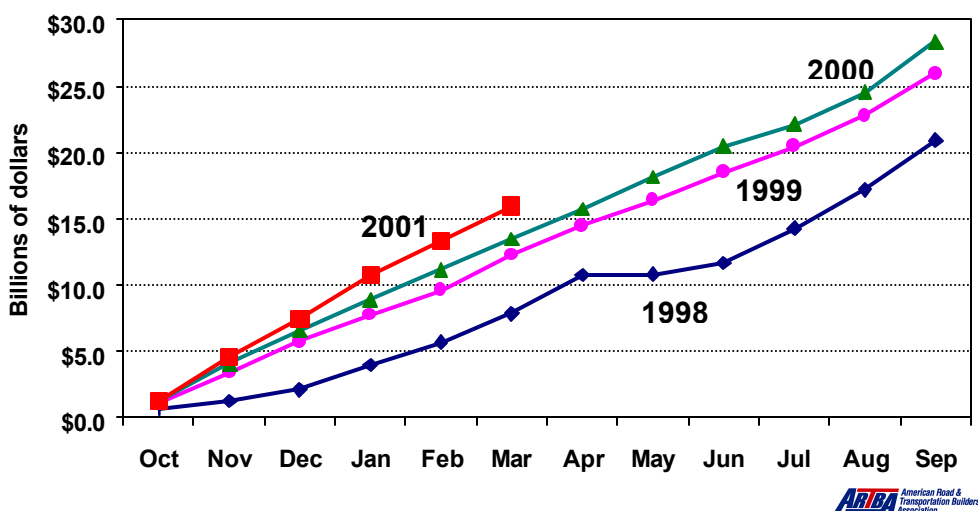

Highlights:

- Amount of funds obligated.** Obligation of federal highway funds by federal, state and local Departments of Transportation (DOT) hit a record \$15.95 billion during the first six months of FY 2001, an increase of \$2.48 billion dollars or 18.4 percent over the first six months of FY 2000. Thirty-four states (two more than in February) and the District of Columbia are ahead of their year-ago pace, while eighteen states are behind last year's pace. State by state data are shown in Table 1, while cumulative data are shown in the chart below. Obligation of federal funds is the first step in the process of bringing federal-aid highway and bridge projects to construction and thus can be an early signal of future construction activity.

- Increase or decrease from FY 2000.** States showing the largest dollar increases were Pennsylvania, Maryland and New Jersey, while Maryland, Delaware and Hawaii showed the largest percentage increases. Largest decreases in dollar terms were registered by Indiana, Arkansas and Nevada, while the largest percentage decreases were in Oregon, Arkansas and Nevada. Details are shown in Table 2. State by state performance in obligating federal funds can be an early signal of future state highway market trends.
- Percent of funds obligated.** During the first six months of FY 2001, the states obligated 56.5 percent of their formula funds. Formula funds must be obligated during the fiscal year or returned to FHWA for redistribution to other states. This is somewhat ahead of the 53.9 percent pace of last year. State DOTs have also obligated 24.7 percent of their Minimum Guarantee, High Priority Project and Appalachian Highway program funds so far this year, up from the year-ago pace of 19.1 percent. These funds are available until used and are not lost if they are not obligated during the fiscal year<sup>1</sup>. State by state details are shown in Table 3.
- Funds remaining.** As of the end of March 2001, states still had \$15.15 billion of obligation authority remaining. This was about \$250 million more than remained at this time a year

ago. States by state details are shown in Table 4. Funds remaining indicate the potential additional market growth that can occur in each state during the remainder of the fiscal year.

- Transfers to Federal Transit Administration. As of March, the state Departments of Transportation had transferred \$418.08 million of federal highway program funds to the Federal Transit Administration for transit uses. While permitted under the federal highway program rules, transfers to the FTA reduce the amount of funds available for highway construction. During FY 2000, the state DOTs transferred a total of \$1.7 billion of highway program funds to the FTA and they are currently about \$140 million ahead of last year's pace. Table 5 shows the state by state details.
  
- Summary. Overall, the increased pace of obligation of federal highway funds so far in FY 2001 continues to be an encouraging sign of future highway and bridge construction activity. The increase over FY 2000 grows larger as the year progresses. Particularly encouraging is the increase in the percent of Minimum Guarantee, High Priority Project and Appalachian highway funds obligated during FY 2001, because there is no time pressure to obligate these funds. Since highway projects take time to plan and let, the strongest impact of the FY 2001 increase should occur during the 2002 and 2003 highway construction seasons.
