Obligation of Federal Highway Funds, FY 2001


Washington, D.C. – Federal, state and local Departments of Transportation (DOT) brought federal fiscal year 2001 to a close by obligating \$2.60 billion of federal highway funds for highway and bridge projects in September, according to an analysis of Federal Highway Administration data by the American Road and Transportation Builders Association.

During FY 2001, a total of \$30.58 billion of federal highway funds was obligated by federal, state and local DOTs for highway, bridge and related projects, an increase of \$2.19 billion or 7.7 percent over the total amount obligated during FY 2000. All states obligated 100 percent of funds required to be obligated during the year. The increase in funds obligated was slightly more than the increase in funds received during the year, largely because states diverted \$450 million less to transit operating and capital expenses in FY 2001 than in FY 2000. At the end of the fiscal year, states had \$3.29 billion of federal funds that had not been obligated and will be carried forward to fiscal year 2002.

When a state or local DOT has an eligible project ready to go under the federal-aid highway program, it enters into a project agreement with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) that obligates the federal government to pay its share of the project cost. The project can then proceed to bidding and construction. Under the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21), federal aid to the states for highway and bridge projects will increase about 50 percent. As states obligate these funds for projects, lettings and construction work should also rise significantly.

[Billions of dollars]



Highlights:

<u>Amount of funds obligated.</u> Federal, state and local Departments of Transportation obligated a record \$30.58 billion of federal highway program funds during federal FY 2001, an increase of \$2.19 billion dollars or 7.7 percent over the total for FY 2000. Obligation of federal funds is the first step in the process of bringing federal-aid highway and bridge projects to construction and thus can be a signal of future construction activity. Forty-one states and the District of Columbia obligated more in FY 2001 than during FY 2000 while eight states obligated less, though most by only small amounts. State by state data are shown in Table 1, while cumulative total data are shown in the chart below.

- State increase or decrease from FY 2000. States showing the largest dollar increases during FY 2001 were California, Virginia and Maryland while Virginia, California and Maryland showed the largest percentage increases. California has transferred much less highway money to the Federal Transit Administration during FY 2001 than during FY 2000, putting \$609 million more of its federal funds into highway and related projects so far this year than last. Virginia and Maryland are also substantially ahead of last year's pace, largely because of major highway and bridge projects cranking up in those states. Georgia, West Virginia, and Nevada registered the largest decreases in dollar terms while the largest percentage decreases occurred in Nevada, Georgia and West Virginia. Details are shown in Table 2. State by state performance in obligating federal funds can be a signal of future state highway market trends.
- <u>Percent of funds obligated.</u> During FY 2001, all states obligated 100 percent of their formula funds, as they have done in all recent years. Formula funds must be obligated during the fiscal year or returned to FHWA for redistribution to other states. The fact that no state returned funds to FHWA during FY 2001 indicates they were all able to come up with the required matching funds. State and local DOTs also obligated 53.9 percent of their available Minimum Guarantee, High Priority Project and Appalachian Highway program funds during

FY 2001, down from the year-ago pace of 56.9 percent. These funds are available until used and are not lost if they are not obligated during the fiscal year¹. State by state details are shown in Table 3.

- Funds remaining. As of the end of FY 2001, states still had \$3.29 billion of obligation authority remaining. This was \$540 million more than remained at the end of FY 2000. State by state details are shown in Table 4. Funds remaining are special program funds that remain available indefinitely until they are used. Most of these unobligated special funds are for high priority projects. Federal funds for these projects were earmarked in TEA-21 by Members of Congress, but in most cases states are still required to put up matching funds. If state DOTs have other priorities for available matching funds, some of the high priority project funds may sit idle for years.
- Transfers to Federal Transit Administration. As of the end of FY 2001, state and local DOTs had transferred \$1.25 billion of federal highway program funds to the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to be used for transit capital and operating expenses. While permitted under federal highway program rules, transfers to the FTA reduce the amount of funds available for highway construction. During FY 2000, state and local DOTs transferred \$1.69 billion of highway program funds to the FTA, about \$437 million more than during FY 2001. California and Washington State report the largest cuts. Table 5 shows the state-by-state details.
- Summary. Overall, federal, state and local DOTs obligated record amounts of federal funds in FY 2001 for highway, bridge and related projects. The total amount of federal funds obligated during FY 2001 was \$30.58 billion. \$2.19 billion more than was obligated during FY 2000. Most states were well ahead of last year's pace in obligating their federal highway funds. A handful obligated less than during FY 2000 but the amounts are generally small. All states obligated all of their available formula funds, which must be obligated before the end of the fiscal year or turned back to FHWA for distribution to other states, which means they were able to raise required matching funds. The strong pace of obligation of federal highway funds in FY 2001 is an encouraging sign of future highway and bridge construction activity. Since highway projects take time to plan and let, the strongest impact of the FY 2001 increase should occur during the 2002 and 2003 highway construction seasons.
