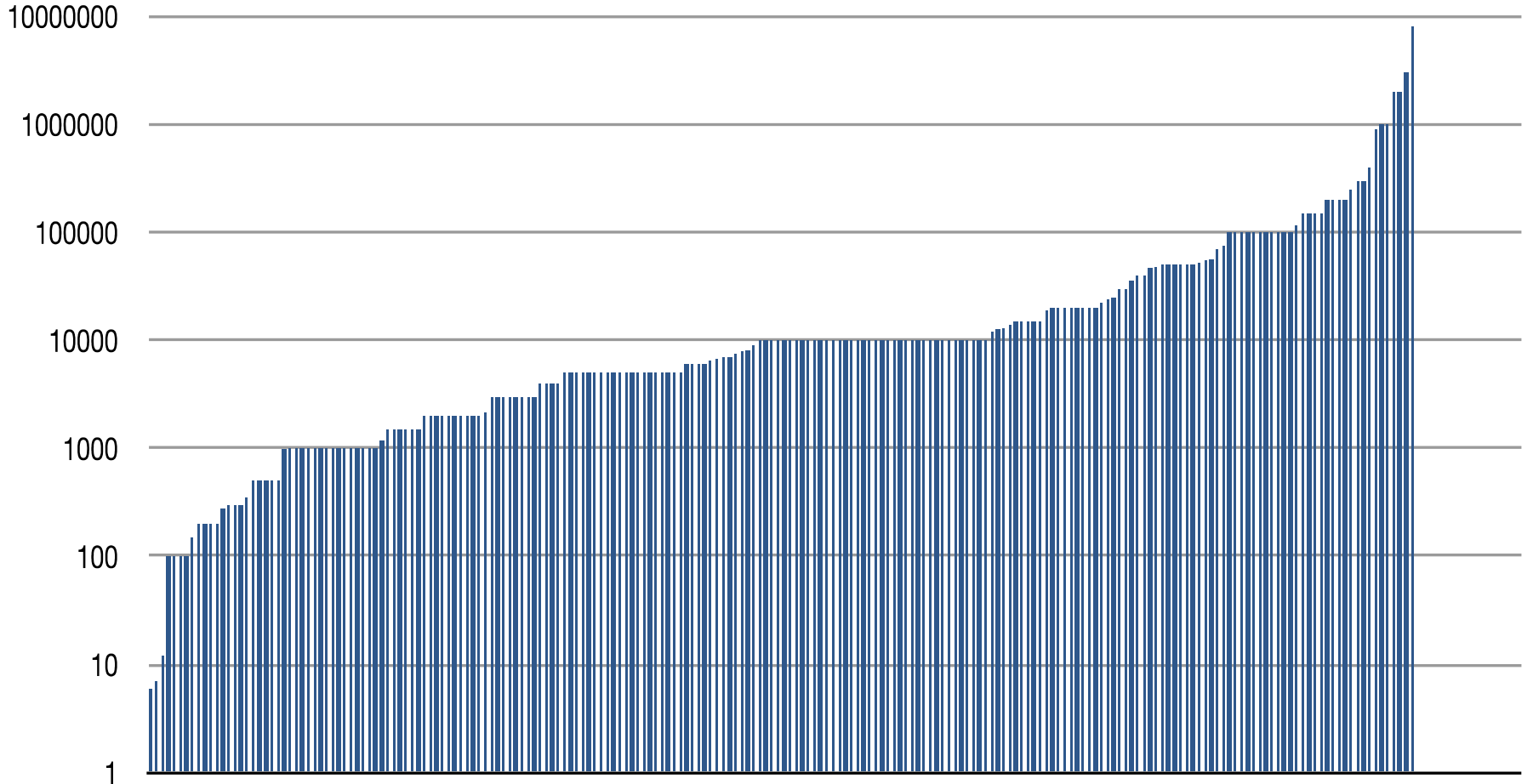

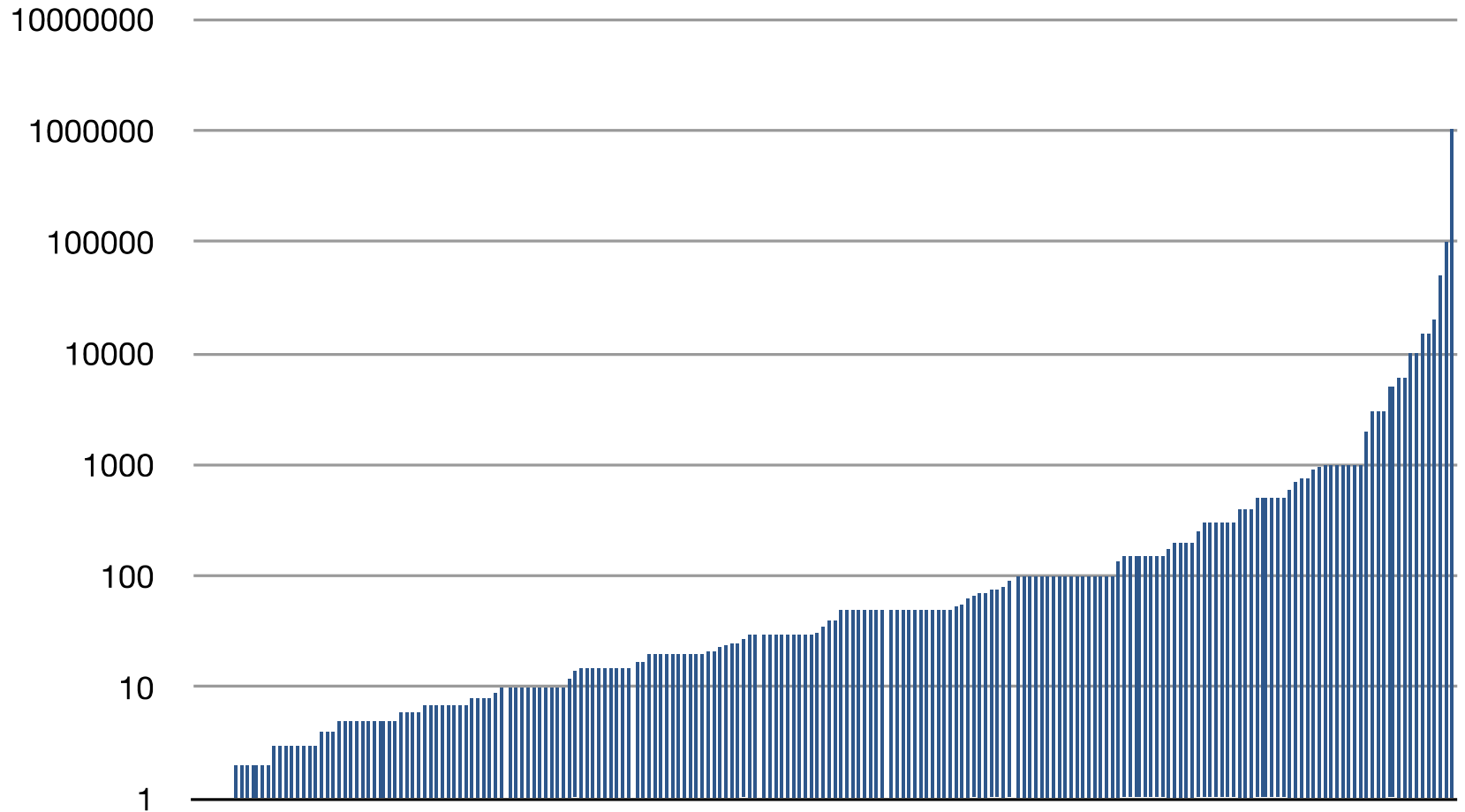
Q1: Homicides Per Year

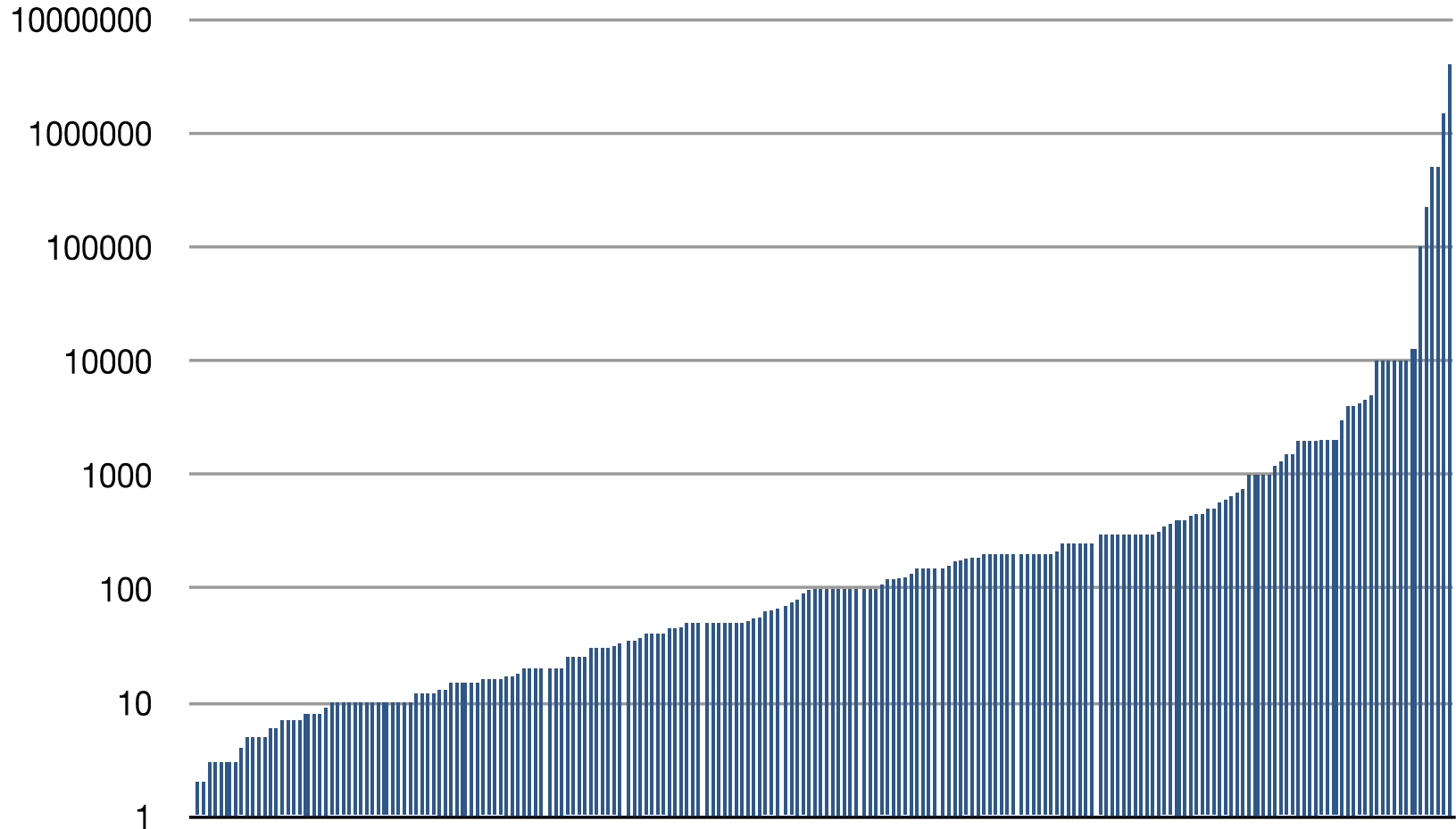
Q2: Executions Per Year

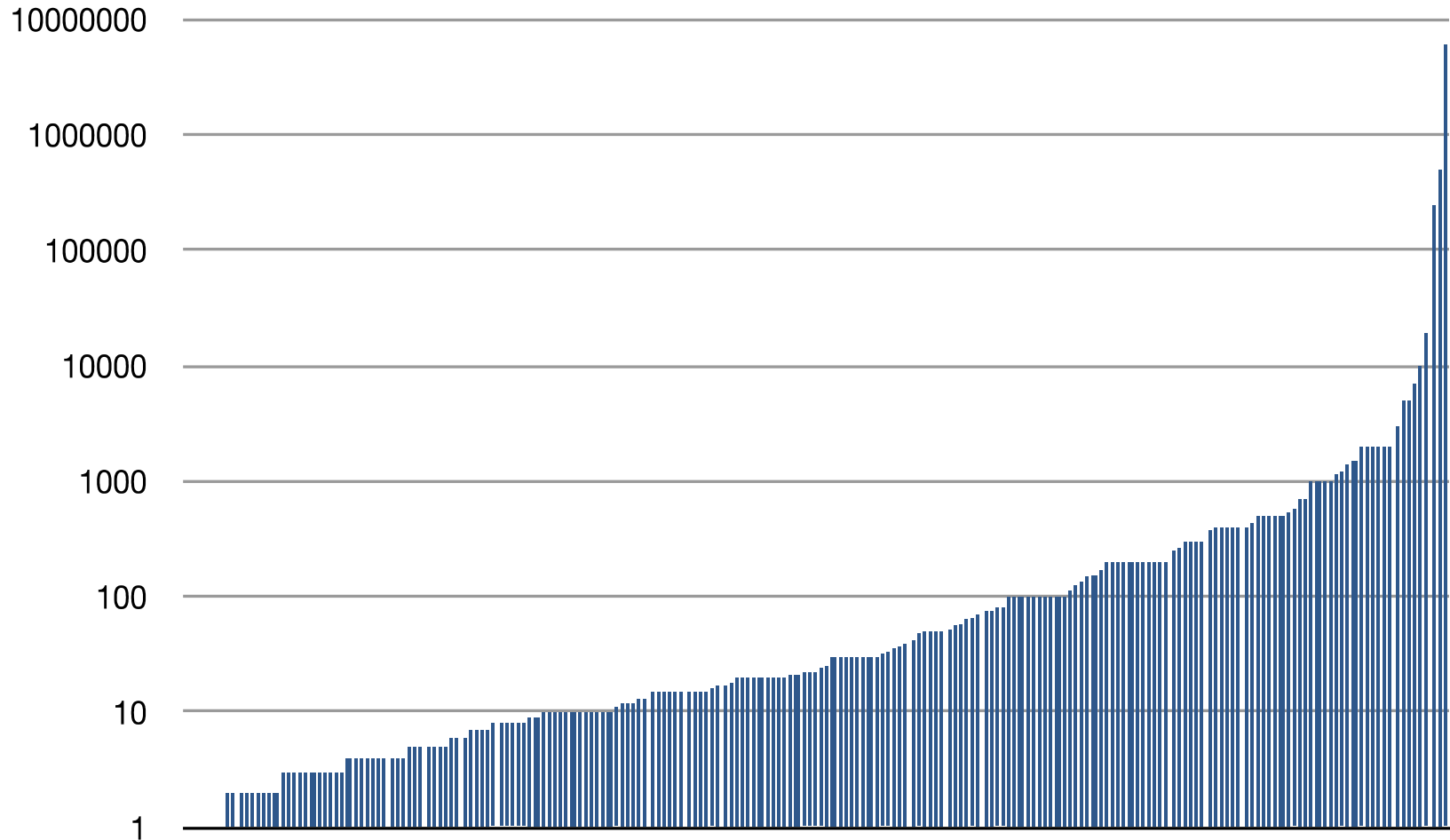
Q3: Peak # of Executions Since 1976

A: 98 (in 1998)

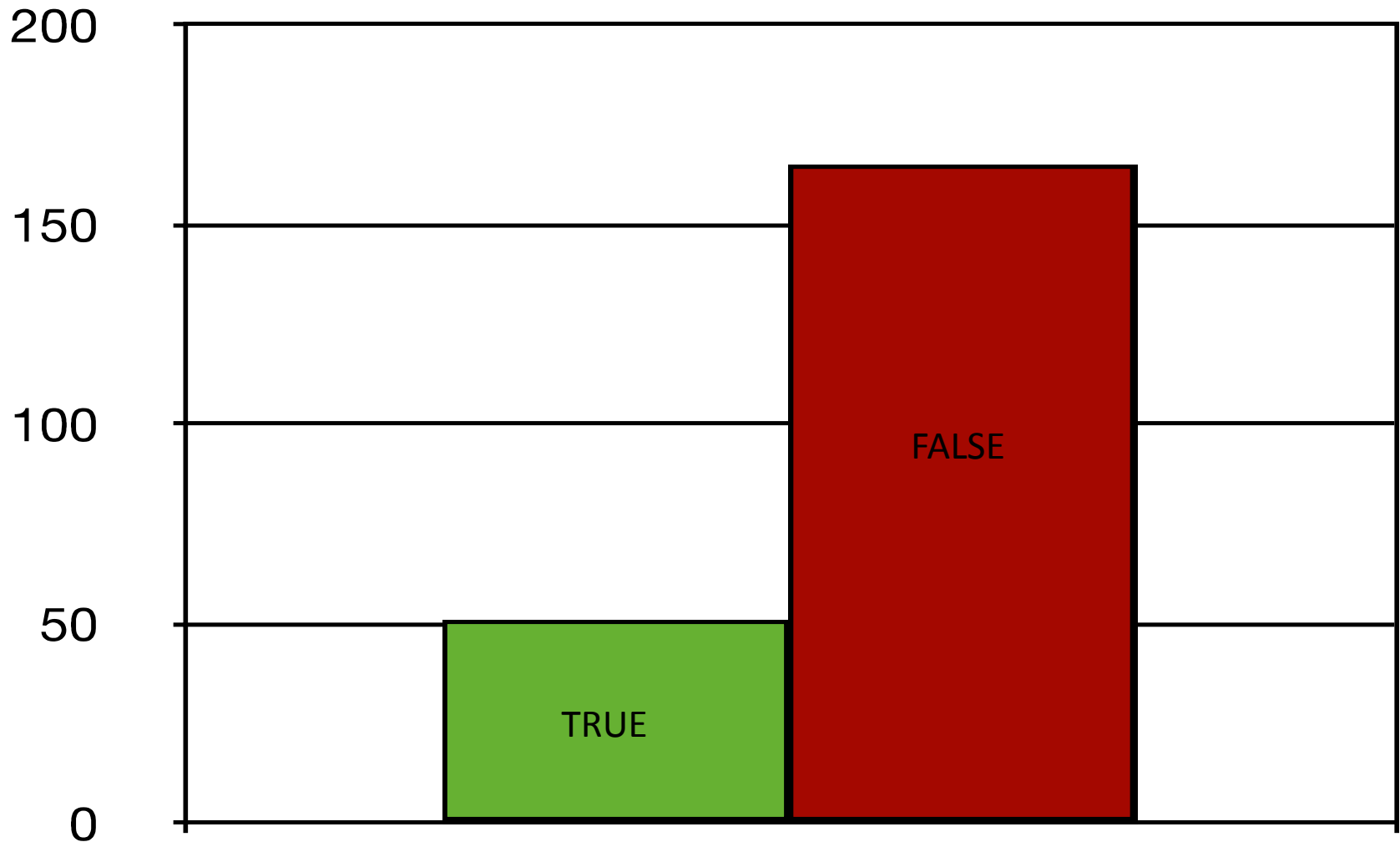


Q4: NC Executions Since 1976

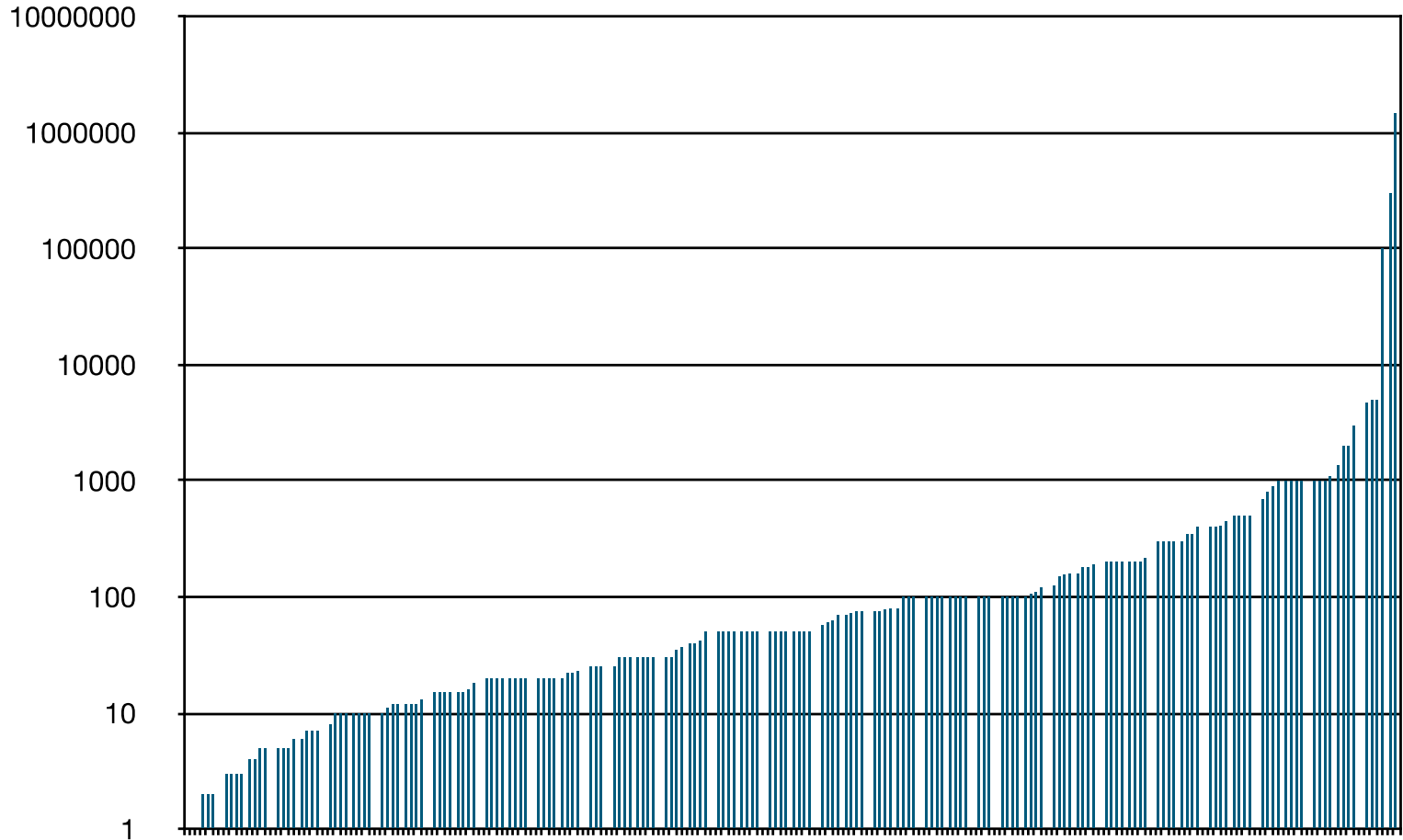


Q5: Cannot Serve on a Capital Jury Unless You Support Death Penalty

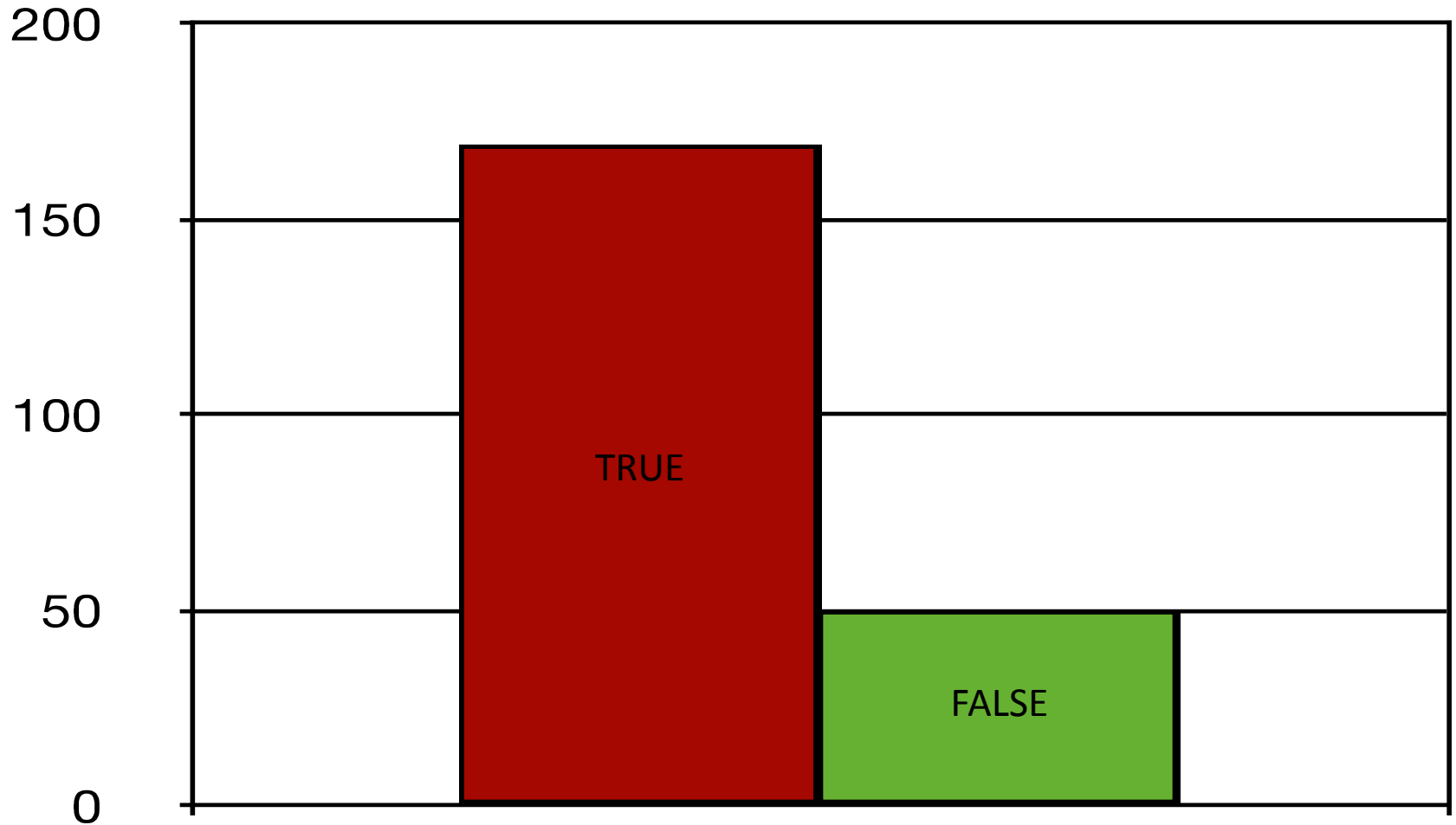


Q6: How Many People Exonerated from Death Row Since 1972

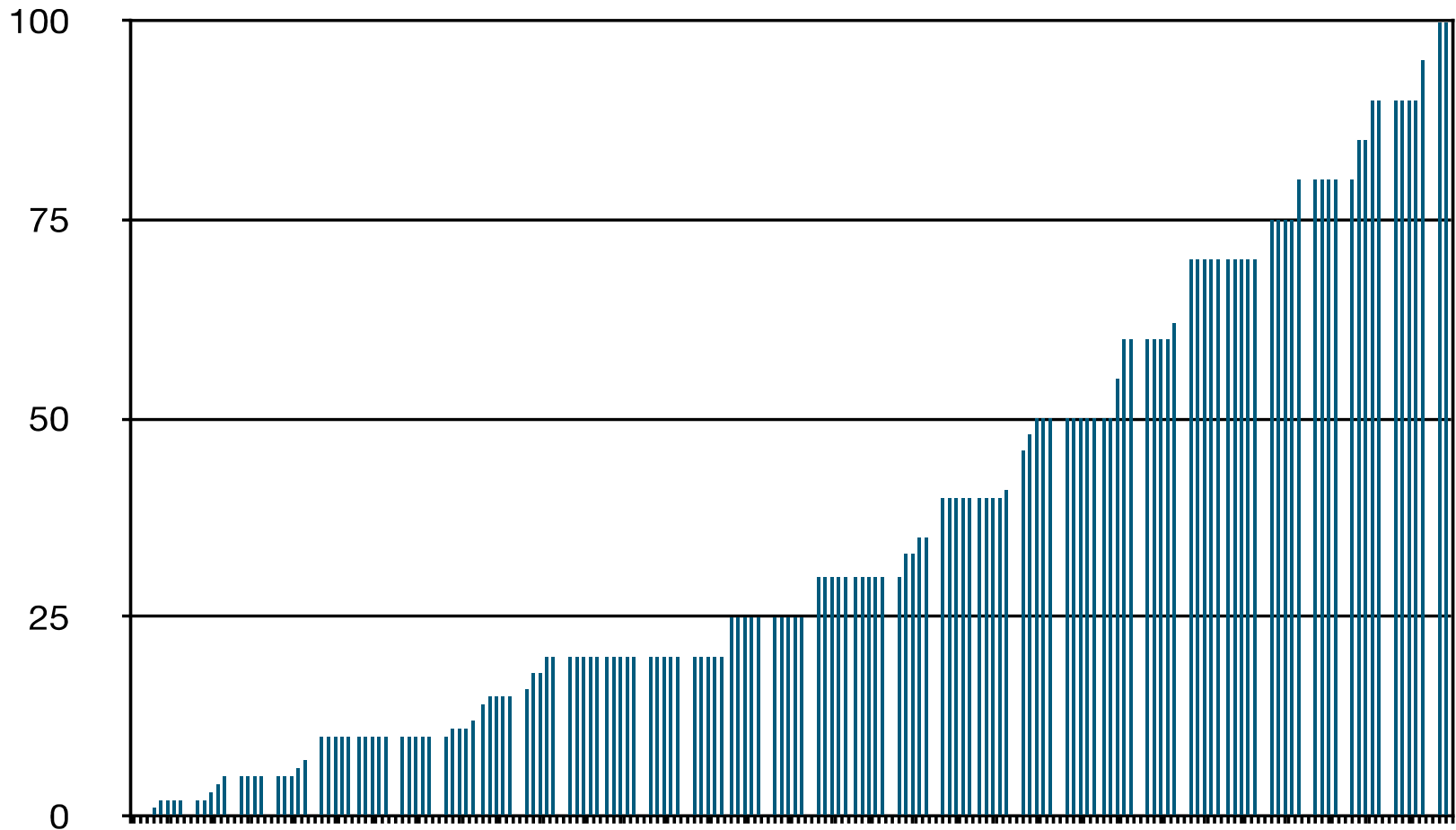


Q7: Most Exonerations Are Due to DNA Evidence



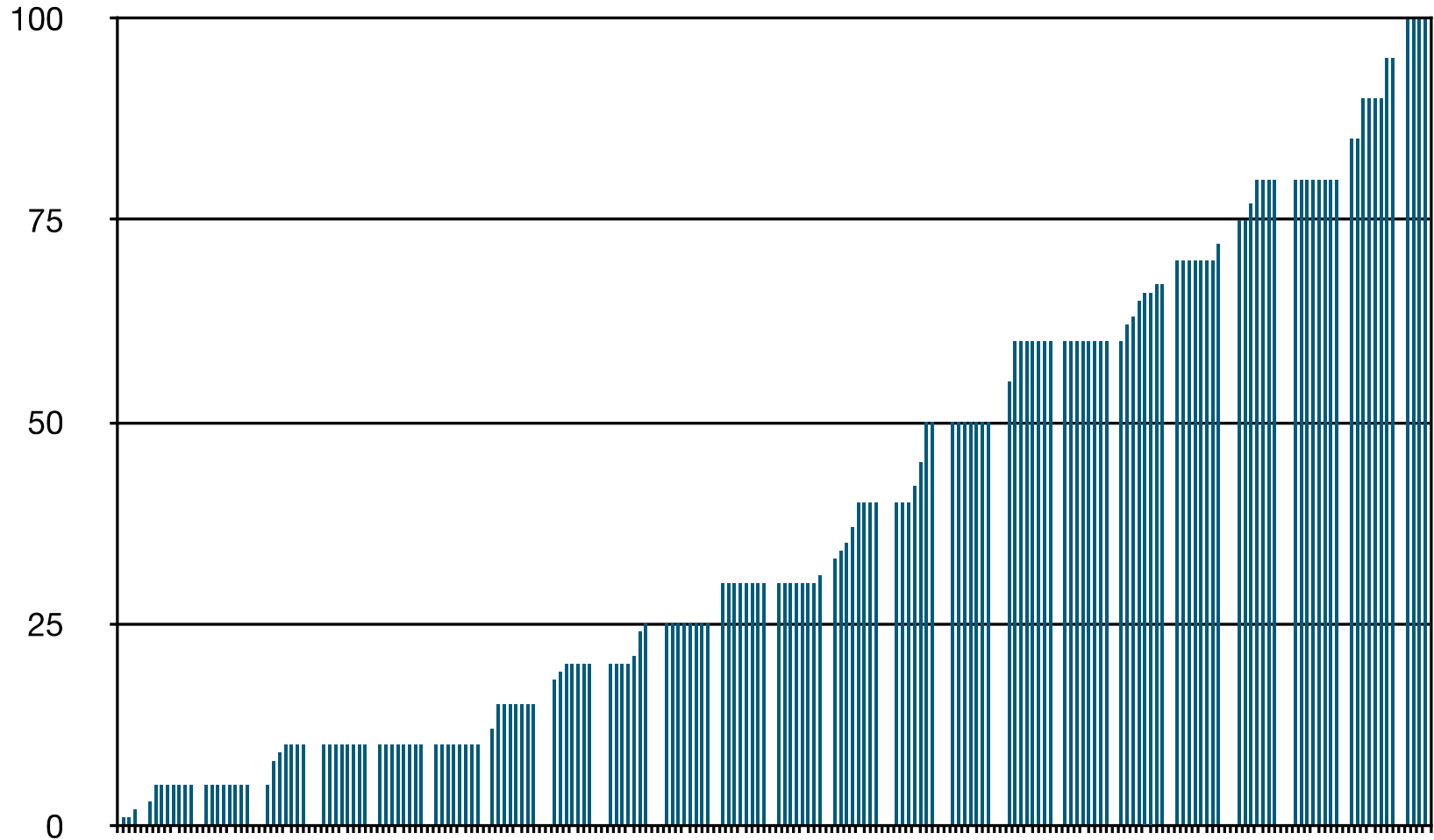
Q8: What % of Death Sentences Are Overturned on Appeal

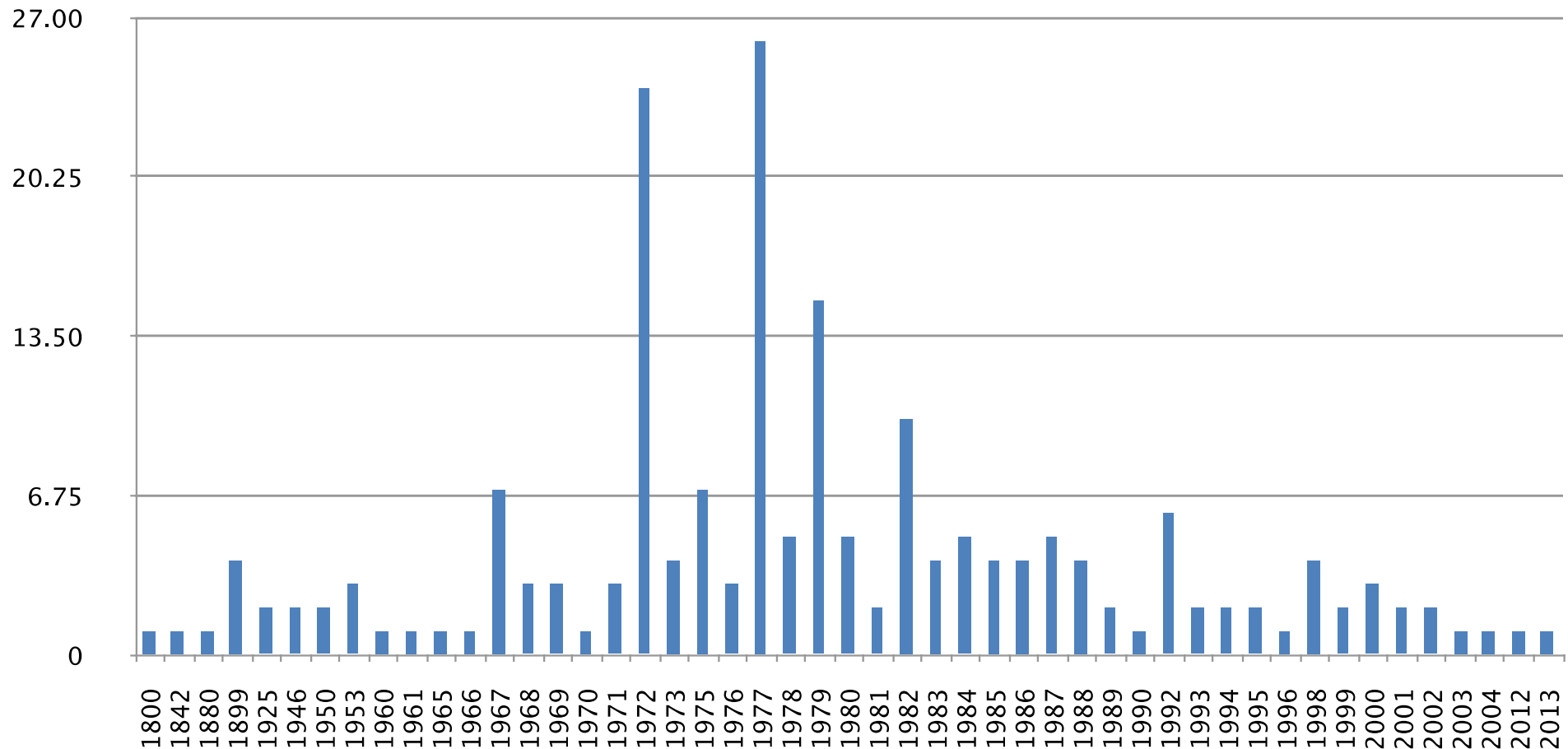
Q9: What % of Death Sentences Lead to an Execution

A: About 20



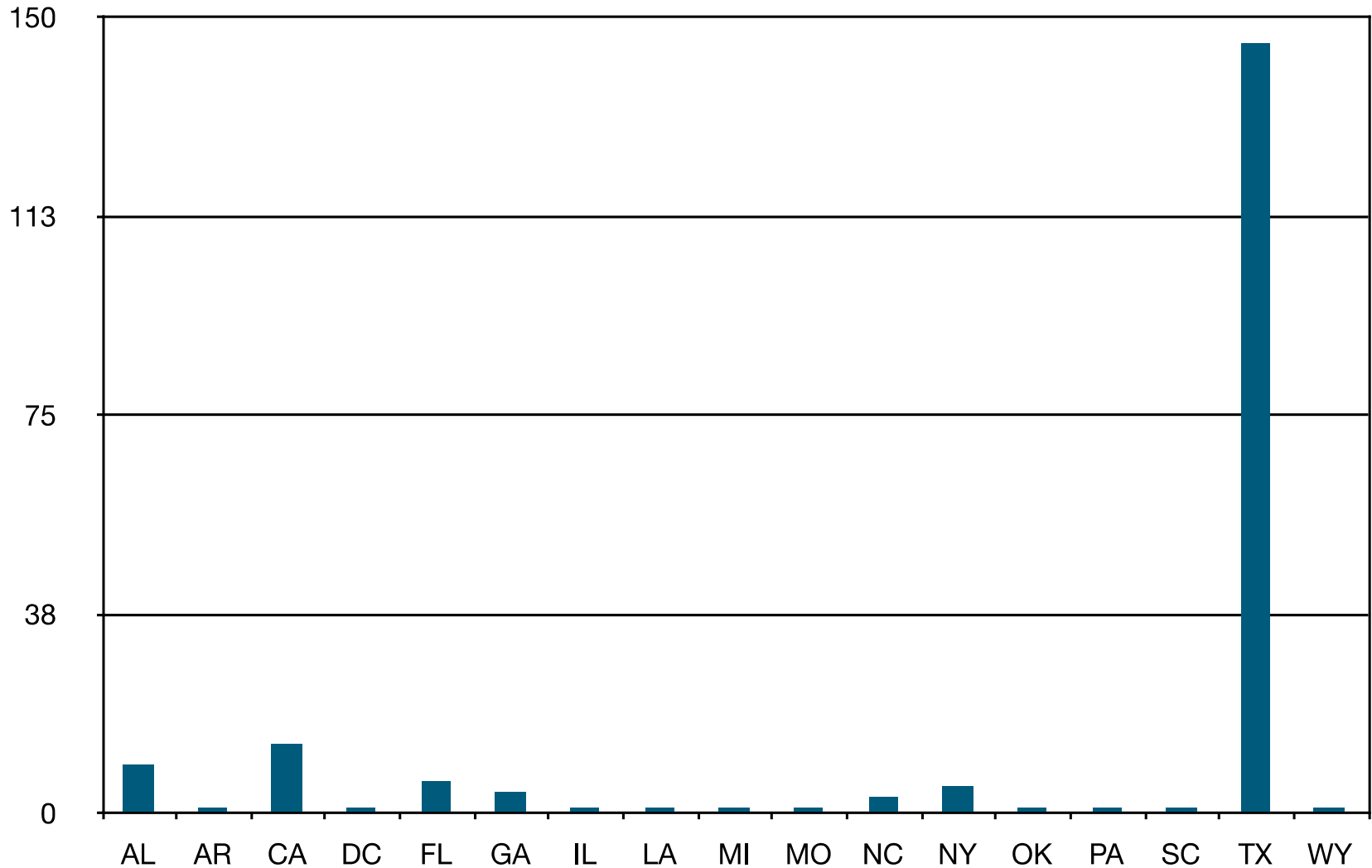
Q10: In What Year Were the Most NC Executions

A: 2003 (7 executions)



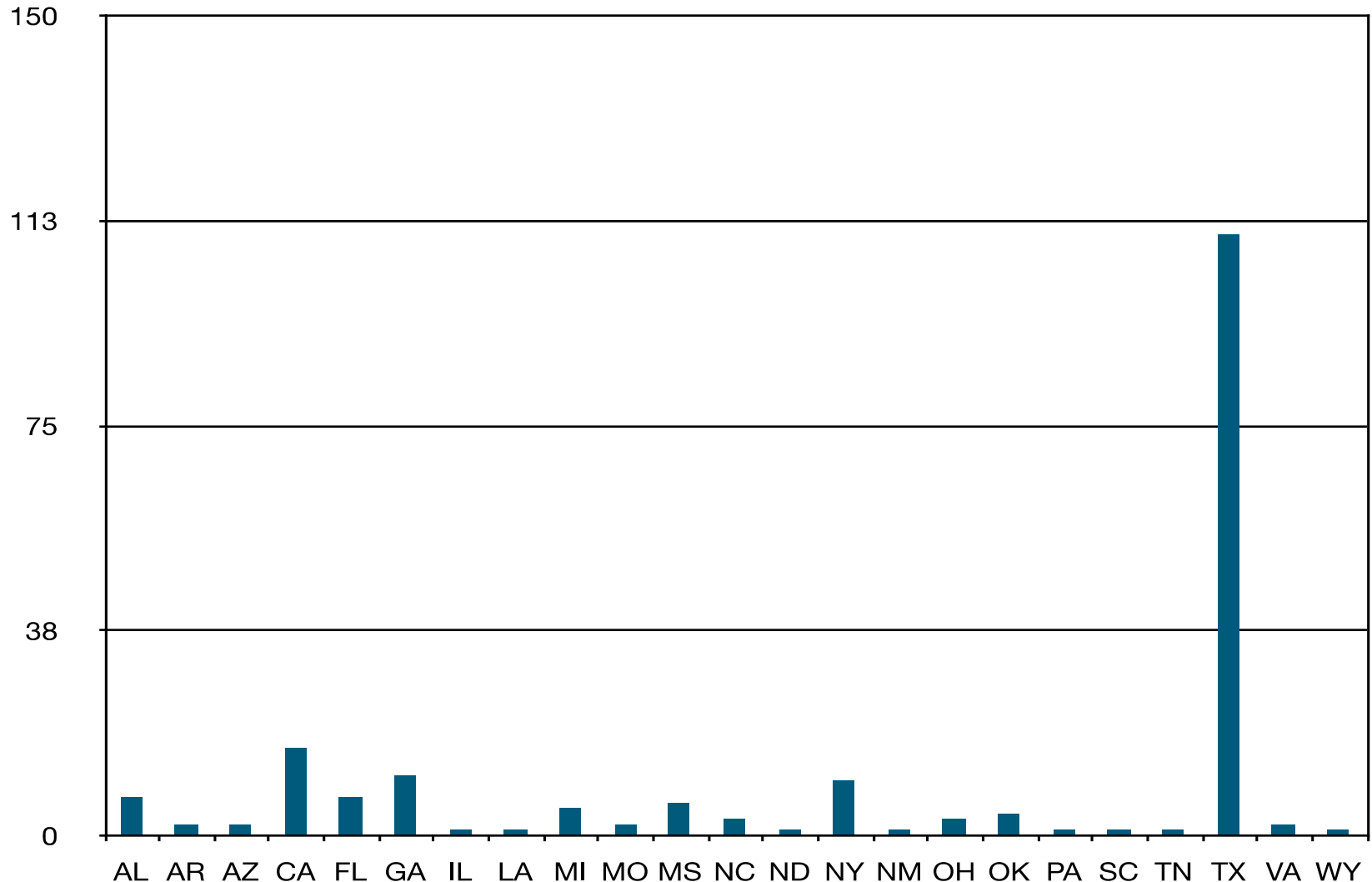
Q11: Which State Has the Greatest # of Executions

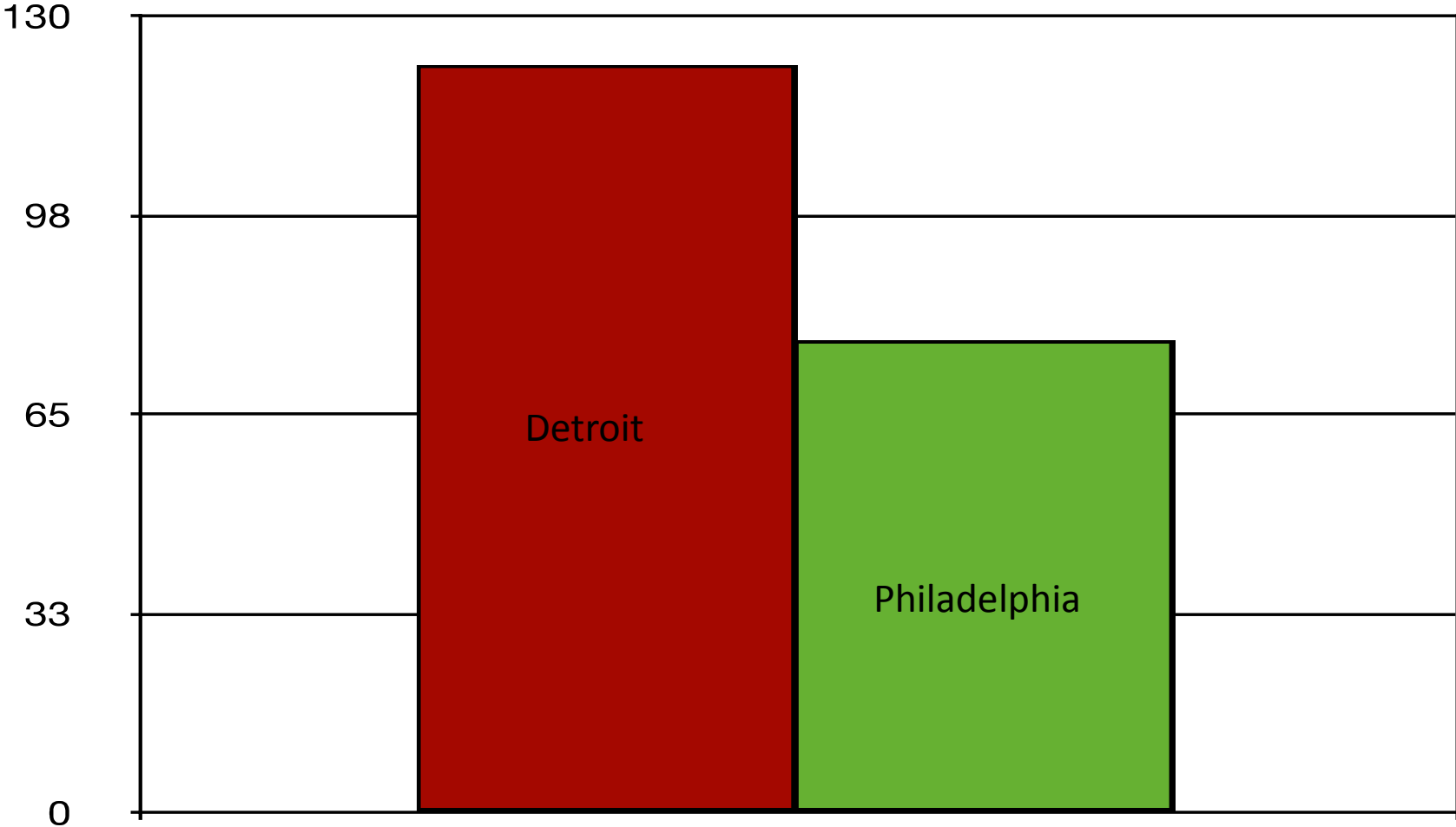


Q12: Which State Has the Greatest # of People on Death Row

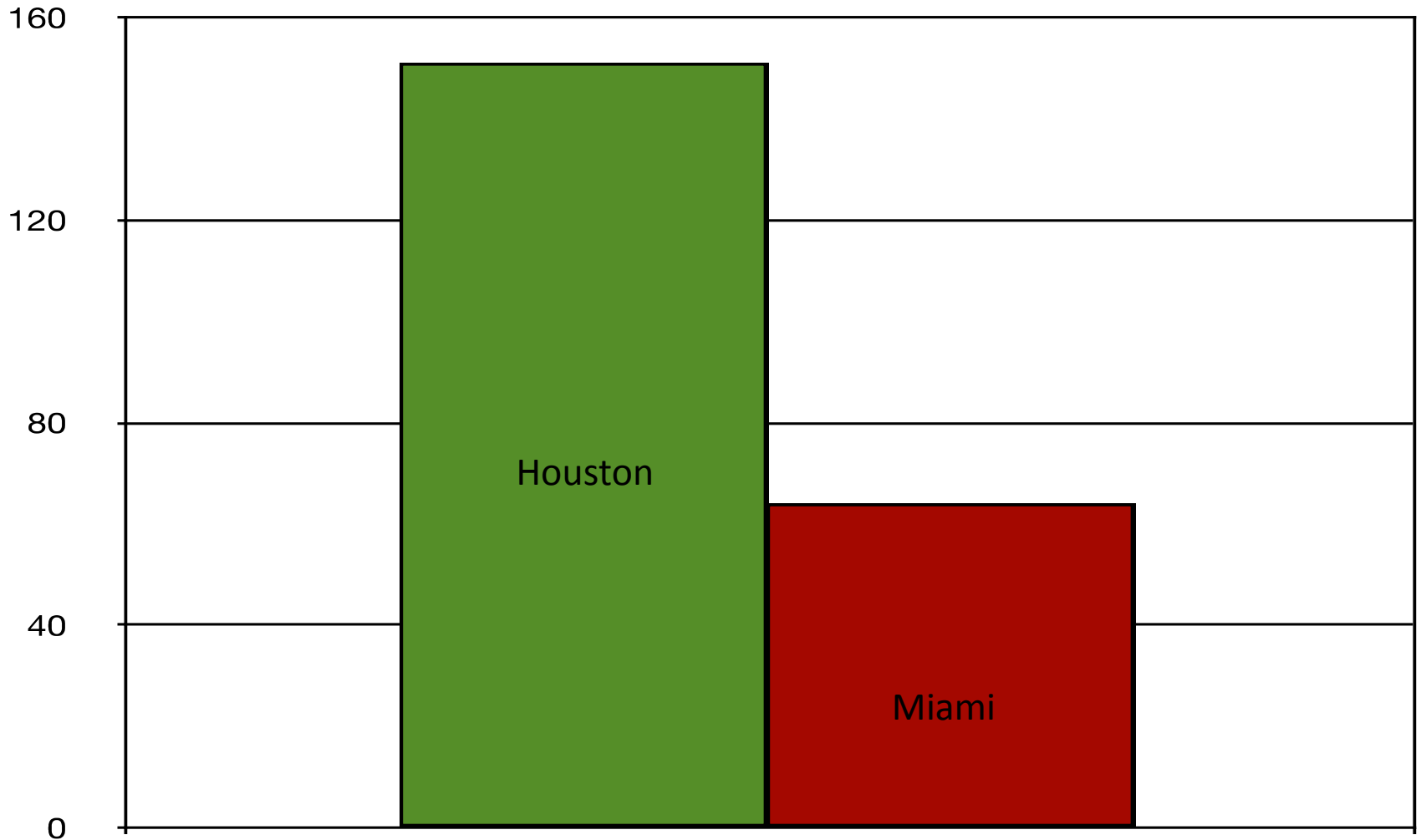

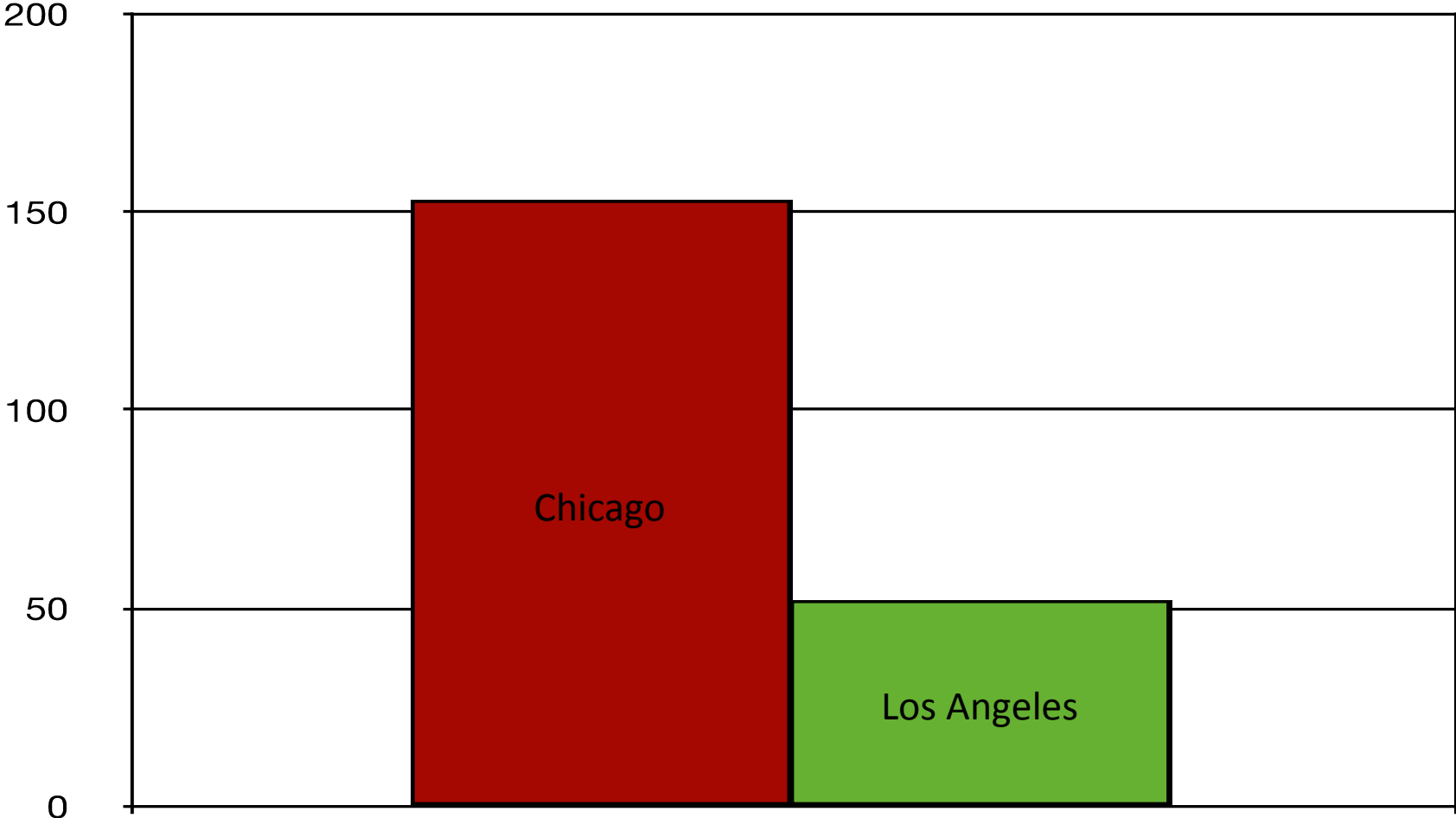
Q13: Which City Has More Death Sentences Since 1976



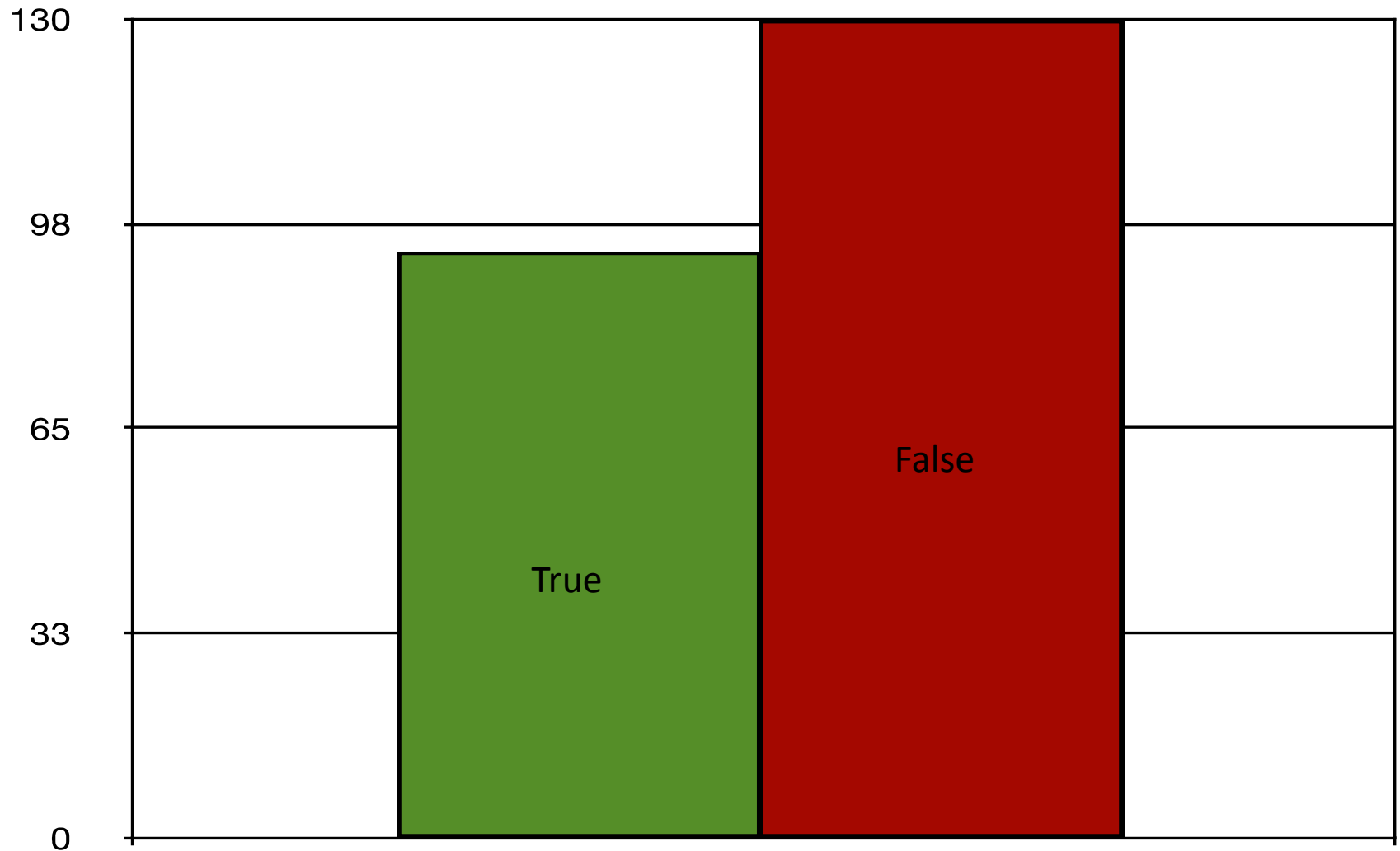
Q14: Which City Has More Death Sentences Since 1976



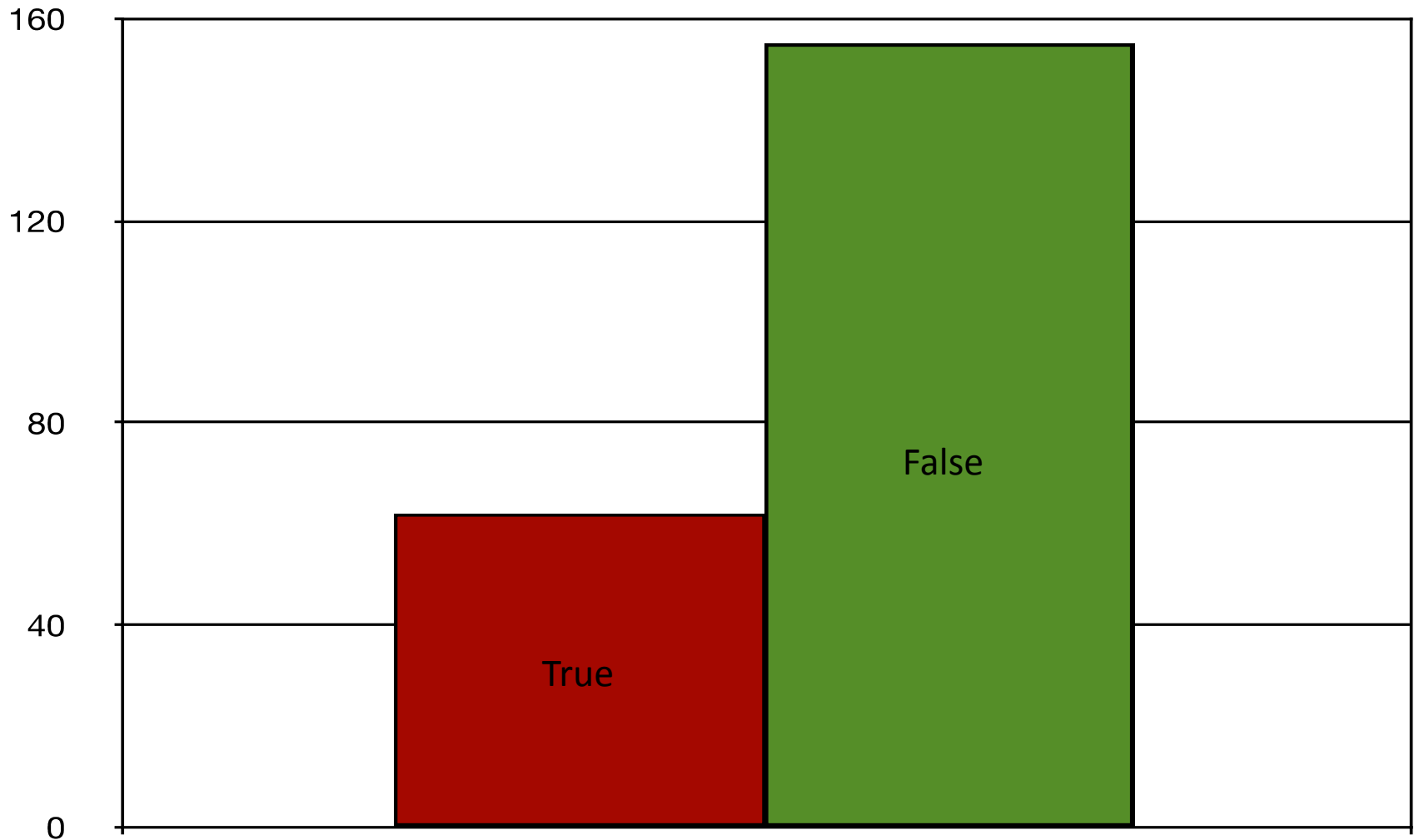
Q15: Which City Has More Death Sentences Since 1976



Q16: There Were No Executions in the US from 1966-1976

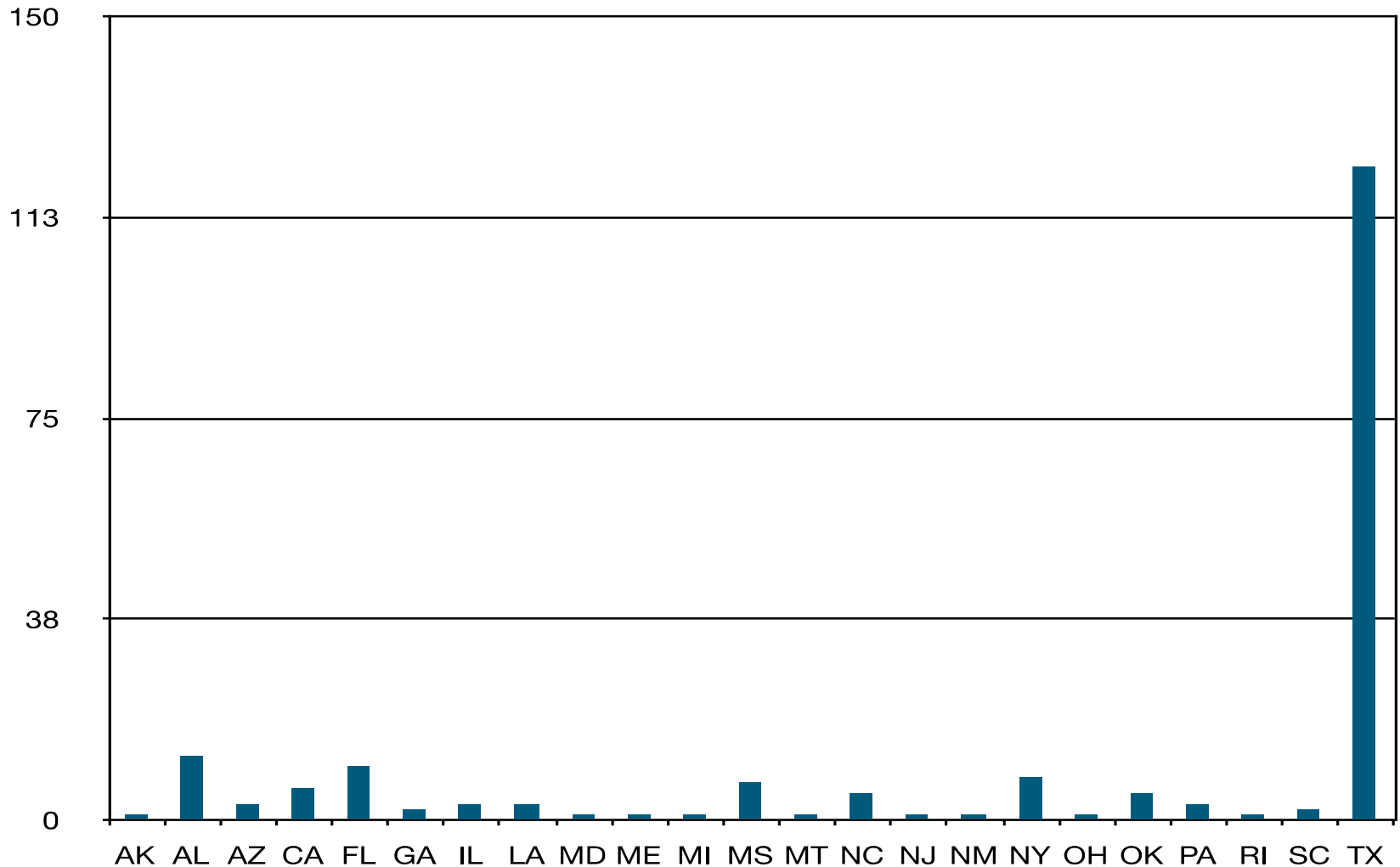


Q17: Since 1976, No State Has Abolished Death Penalty by Vote



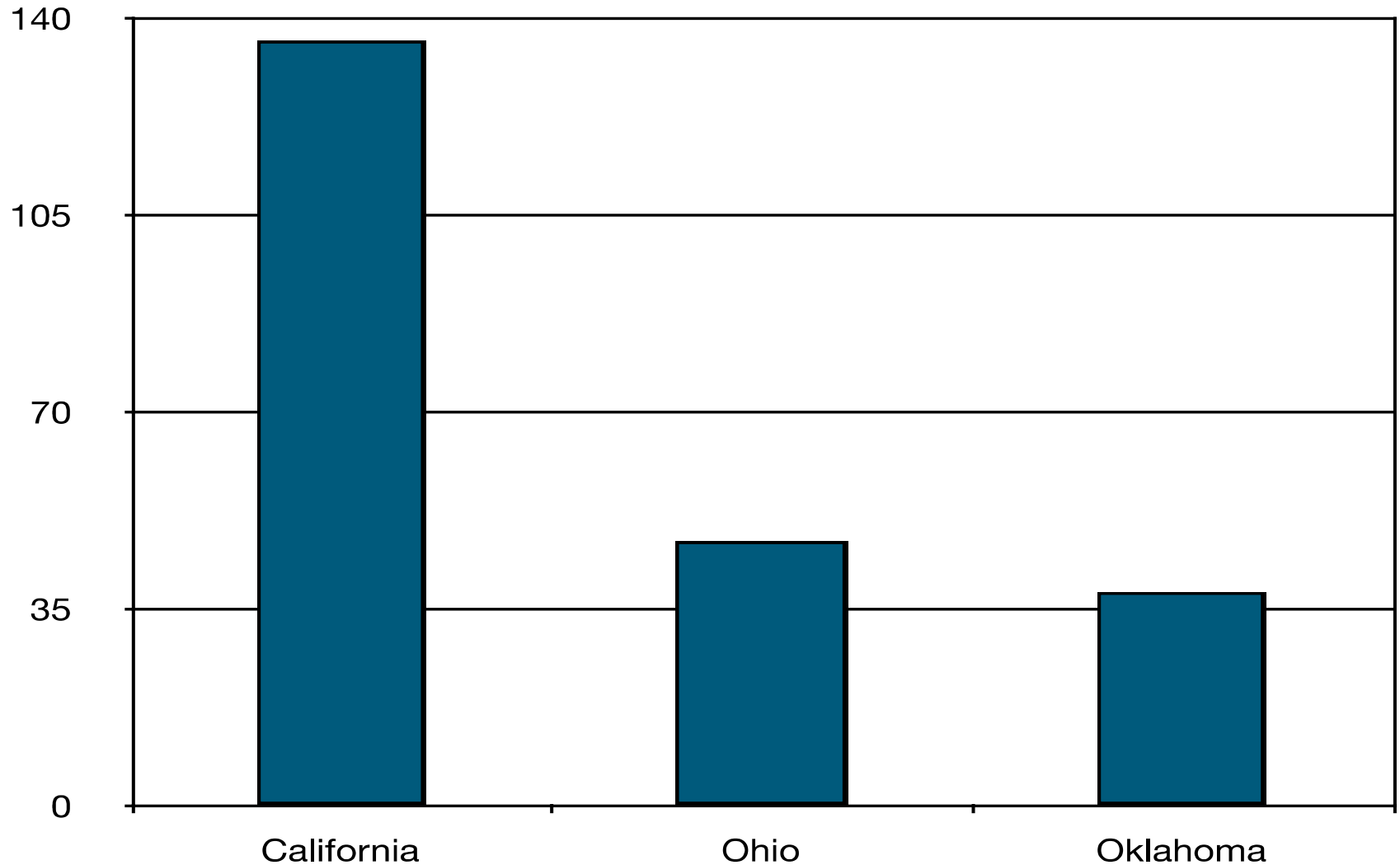
Q18: Which State is Most Likely to Execute the Inmates it Condemns

A: VA



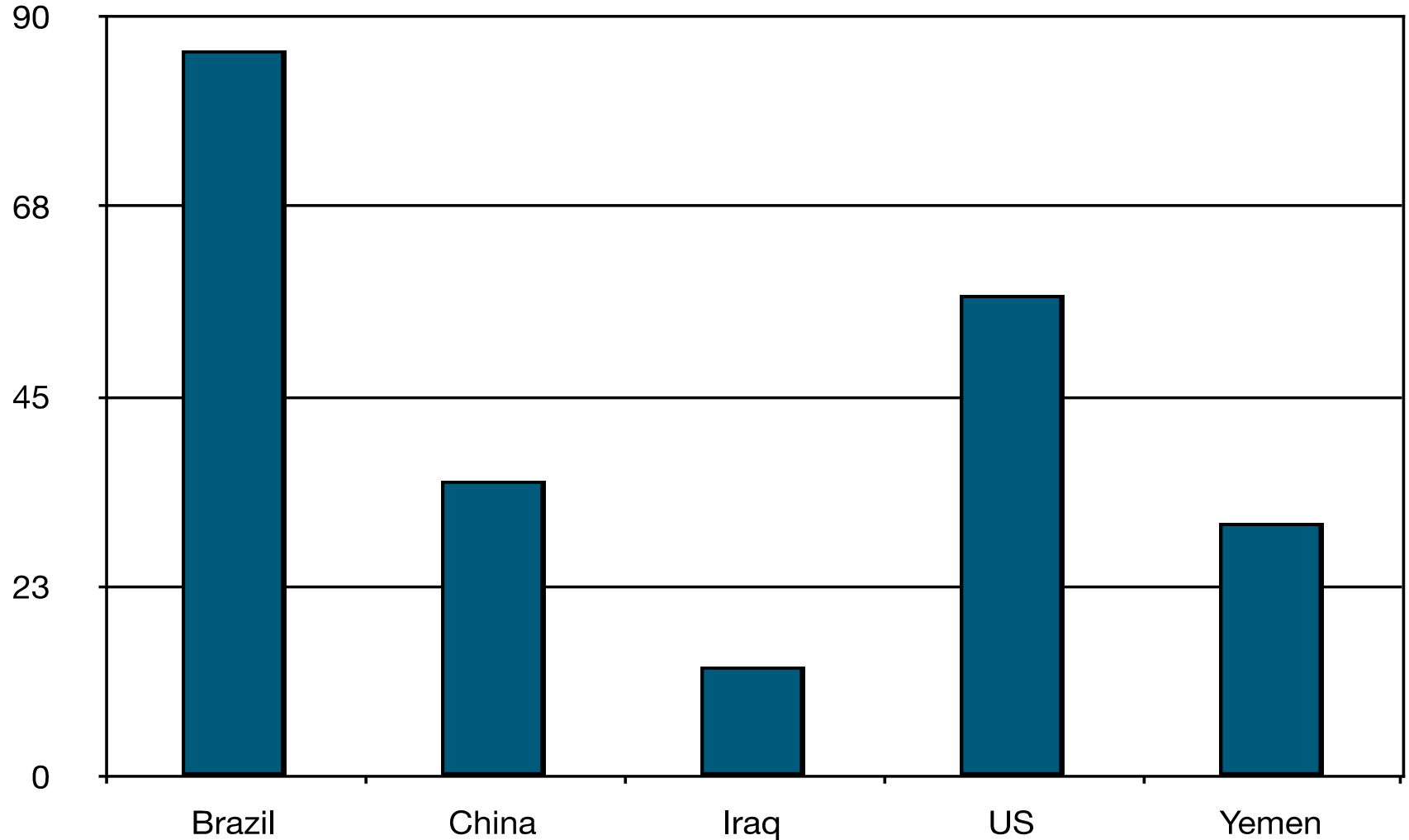
Q19: Which State is Very Unlikely to Carry Out a Death Sentence

A: CA

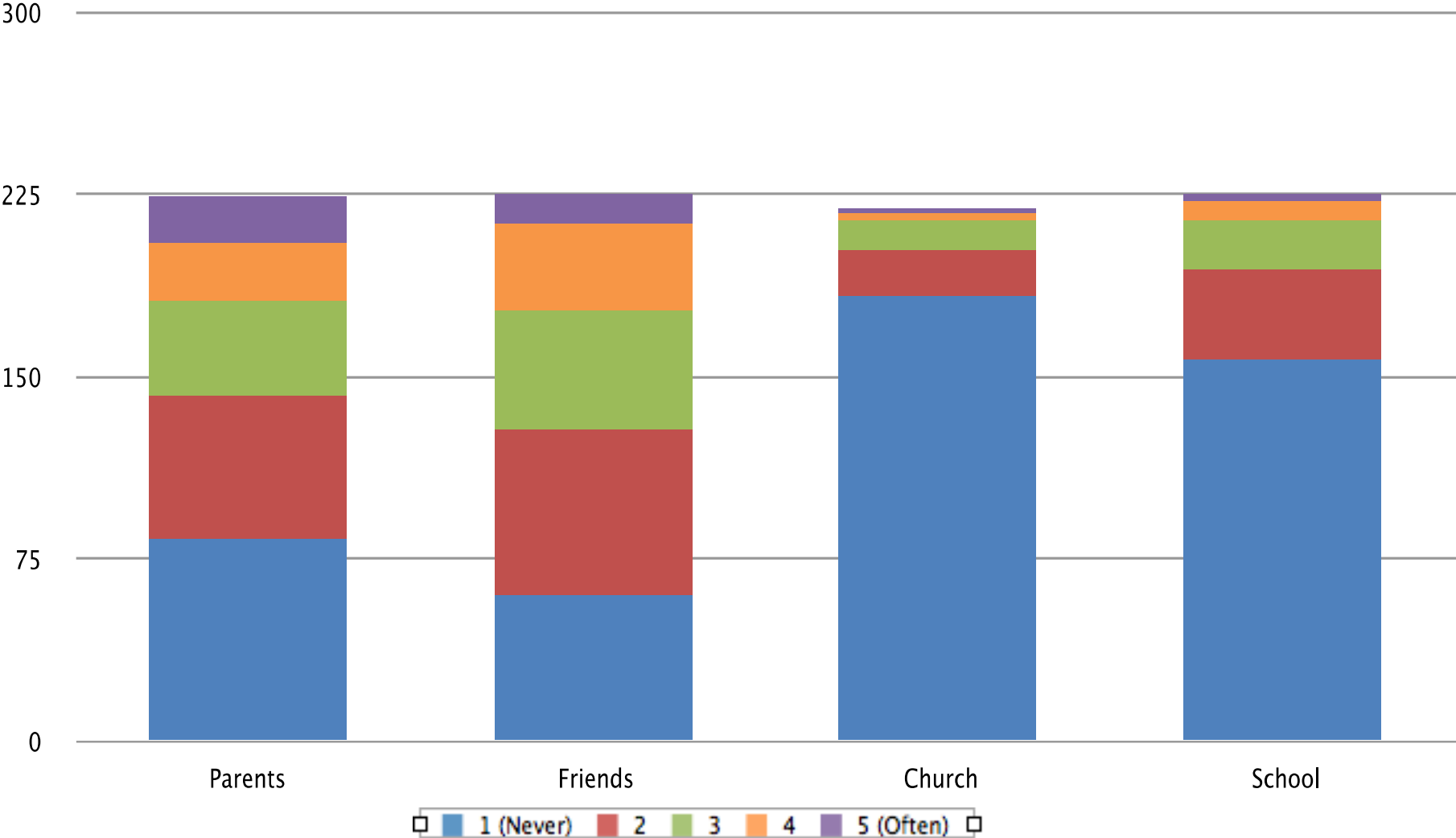


Q20: Which Country Does Not Belong on the High Execution List

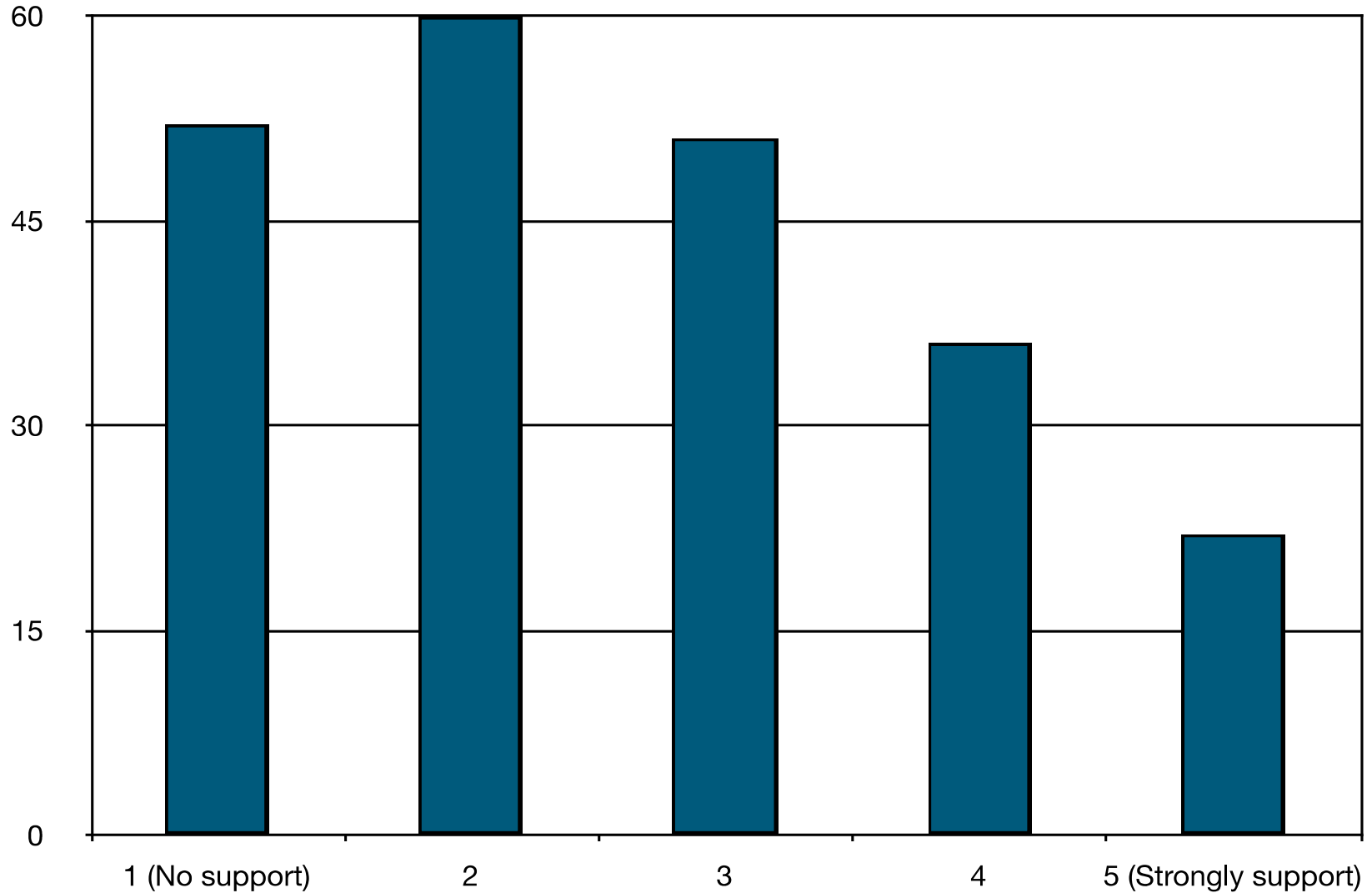
